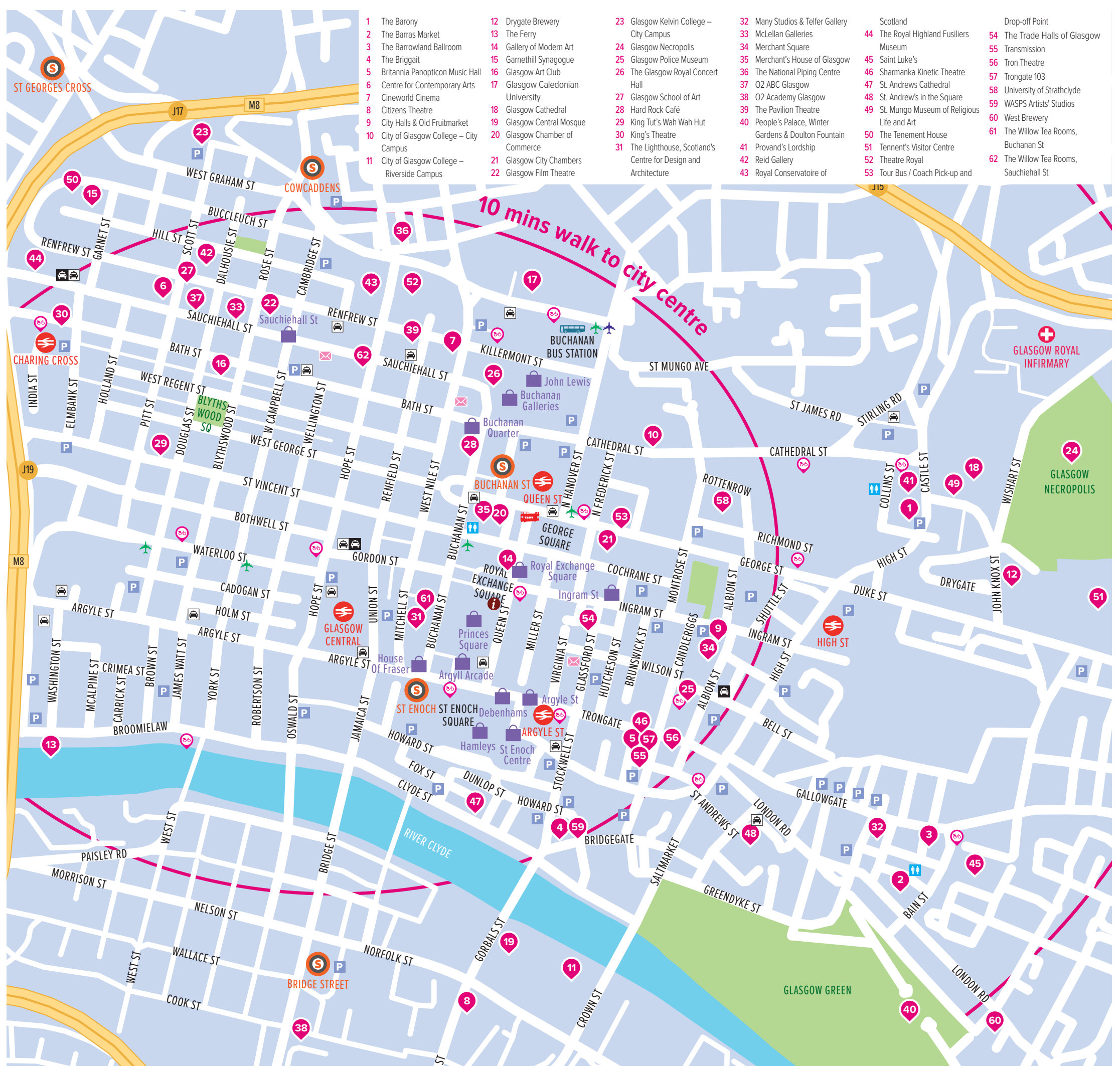

Historic Attractions

People's Palace, Winter Gardens & Doulton Fountain

The People's Palace is set in historic Glasgow Green and tells the story of how Glaswegians lived, worked and played from the 18th to the 20th century. Just outside stands the Doulton Fountain, thought to be the largest terracotta fountain in the world.

Provand's Lordship

Step back in time and discover Glasgow's unique history with a visit to the oldest house in the city, built in 1471. It was originally part of a hospital and is one of only four medieval buildings to survive in Glasgow. Outside enjoy St. Nicholas' Garden.

Glasgow Cathedral

Glasgow Cathedral is thought to have been built on the site of St Kentigern's tomb and marks the birthplace of the City of Glasgow. One of Scotland's most magnificent medieval buildings, it is the only one on the Scottish mainland to survive the Reformation of 1560 intact.

Glasgow Necropolis

The Necropolis is a Victorian garden cemetery full of wonderful architecture and sculpture with monuments designed by leading Glaswegian architects including Alexander 'Greek' Thomson, Bryce, Hamilton and Mackintosh. Adjacent to Glasgow Cathedral, the Necropolis was modelled on Père-Lachaise in Paris.

City Chambers

Majestically looking over George Square stands one of the city's most important and prodigious buildings – the City Chambers. This Victorian masterpiece is recognised as one of the most beautiful in the UK and has for over four hundred years been the headquarters of successive councils serving the City of Glasgow.

Public tours are conducted twice per day Monday-Friday subject to council business.

Charles Rennie Mackintosh

The Mackintosh House

The interiors of 6 Florentine Terrace, Glasgow - home of Charles Rennie Mackintosh and Margaret Macdonald Mackintosh from 1906 to 1914 - meticulously reassembled within the University of Glasgow's Hunterian Art Gallery.

Scotland Street School Museum

A must see for Mackintosh fans. Impressive leaded glass towers, magnificent tiled entrance hall, unique stonework and mastery of the interplay of light and space.
